Conversations with Children About Racism and Racial Slurs

Recently, across our school district and at DeBeck, we've seen an increase in the use of racial slurs and harmful language. It's crucial for all of us to proactively address this issue. When such language is used, it undermines the sense of safety and belonging for everyone in the community.

At school, we address these incidents through education (helping students understand the meaning and impact of their words), appropriate consequences, and open communication with families.

To support this effort, here is a guide for parents on how to address racial slurs, support your child, and foster an inclusive and respectful environment:

Start a Conversation

Engage your child in an open discussion about the issue. Ask questions like:

- "What happened at school today?"
- "I heard about a racial slur being used—what do you know about it?"
- "How do you think that word might make someone feel?"

Educate About Respect and Empathy

Help your child understand why racial slurs are harmful. Explain that these words can cause deep emotional pain and perpetuate harmful stereotypes. Encourage them to reflect on how they would feel if the slur were directed at them or someone they care about.

Celebrate Diversity

Teach your child to value and respect diversity. Explain that every individual has the right to feel safe and respected, regardless of their background, skin color, or ethnicity. Encourage them to see differences as something to learn from and celebrate.

Set Clear Expectations

Make it clear that using slurs or discriminatory language is unacceptable. Establish firm expectations about respectful language and behavior at home and elsewhere. Explain the consequences of using such language and ensure that these consequences are consistent.

Recently our district hosted a Parent/Caregiver workshop about cell phones facilitated by Hannah Beach. Here is the description of the session:



Many of our kids are anxious and glued to their phones, seeking endless distraction and feeling isolated and disconnected. Aggressive outbursts have become

common and yet others seem to have stopped talking all together. As parents and caregivers, we are increasingly alarmed. We entice, cajole, bribe, encourage, shout, but nothing seems to work long term.

Join Hannah for a warm and conversational workshop exploring practical strategies we can use to help our children and youth when it comes to managing devices. This conversation has never been more important as we look at how we can support our children and youth to grow, learn, develop, and reach their fullest potential.
