WHO CAN REGISTER

Kindergarten to Grade 12 students who:

- are currently attending a school (public or private) in British Columbia;
- have not graduated and are under 19 years old on June 30, 2025;
- are a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or convention refugee/refugee claimant;
- along with their parent/guardian(s), are ordinarily resident in British Columbia;
- whose parent has been lawfully admitted to Canada for temporary residence, and is authorized to work for a period of one year or more, and is/will be employed for at least 20 hours per week;
- whose parent is authorized to study for a period of one year or more and holds a valid study permit.

Students who meet the above criteria are eligible for Ministry-funded courses in British Columbia.

International students who hold a valid study permit and reside in BC (but whose parents do not normally reside in BC) ***may attend Summer Learning for a fee.***

REGISTRATION HOW-TO

STEP 1

Create a **customer account** on www.richmondce.ca, using either (i) parent's name then adding student as a family member to the account OR (ii) using student's legal name. [click on Register Online icon > top right corner - Create an Account]

If an account has been previously set up, check to make sure log in information, email and customer type is current. To reset log in name/passwords, please contact rce@sd38.bc.ca (include account holder's name, date of birth and any changes required. If a change of customer type/status is required, please provide status documents - PR card/Canadian passport/work permit).

STEP 2

Review course offerings, noting registration start dates and times for each of the summer programs.

STEP 3

Make sure you have your child's 9-digit **Personal Education Number (PEN)**. PEN can be found on your child's report card, the MyEdBC parent portal or from your child's school.
* PEN numbers will need to be entered at the time of course registration.

NOTE: Steps 1-3 can be completed prior to registration date/time.

STEP 4 - Register Online

Find the course that you are registering for or search by keyword in a course name. Click "Enroll Now", then enter Login Name and Password. Select the name of participant for the course. Click "Add to Cart", then "Checkout".

Be prepared to answer some custom questions, e.g. name of your child's current school, PEN, any allergies or health conditions to note, any special learning support required.

Process payment of course fees by credit card, if required.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Registration fees are charged according to student's status at the time of registration (PR/Canadian/International/Parent Work-Study Permit). **Fees will NOT be refunded should student status change between time of registration and course start.**

WHAT IF ...

I can't log into my account; my account is locked.

> Be sure to log in through REGISTER ONLINE button, not Login. Contact Continuing Education office at rce@sd38.bc.ca, providing account holder's name and date of birth.

Do I create an account using the student's name or as a parent?

> Accounts may be created using a parent's name, then adding student as a Family Member. This will be useful when registering for multiple students.

When creating an account for a student, be sure to use their full legal name (include usual name in brackets).

How will I know if I have successfully registered or if I am waitlisted?

> All transactions will generate a receipt that is emailed to the email address on account. Receipts will indicate "Enroll" (successfully registered) or "Pending Enrolment" if waitlisted.

> To check online, log into account and click "Transaction and Payment History".

STEP 5

If a course is full, be sure to add student's name to the waitlist by clicking on the course name - "+ Wait List". Consider carefully which course you'd like to be waitlisted for - students may only put their name on a maximum of **six (6) waitlists**.

As space becomes available, parents/students will be contacted by phone or email (by Fri July 11). Take note of our number 604-668-6123 in case we call. As waitlists can be long, if we do not hear back within 24 hours, we will move on to the next waitlisted student.

STEP 6

Once a transaction (successfully registered or waitlisted) is completed, you will receive a transaction receipt via email from Richmond Continuing Education. Note whether receipt indicates "Enroll" for successful registration, or "Pending Enrolment" if being waitlisted.

STEP 7 - for students attending a public school outside of Richmond or a private school within BC

To determine eligibility for Ministry-funded courses, please email rce@sd38.bc.ca or present the following documents in-person at the Richmond Continuing Education office (12091 Cambie Road):

- student's birth certificate, permanent resident card, study permit; AND
- parent's birth certificate, permanent resident card, Canadian passport, or valid BC work permit together with BC employment letter and two current paystubs; AND
- parent's BC Driver Licence, BC Services Card, utility bill.

WHAT IF ...

My child goes to Garden City School which is on an alternate calendar - can they attend Summer Learning?

> Yes - however they will miss about half of Summer Learning. Please note that if registering for summer camps, full camp fees apply.

I am a Gr 12 student who will be 19 after July 1. I will graduate in June but I need more courses to apply for university. Can I take them during Summer Learning?

> No - only non-graduate, school age students (under 19 on June 30, 2025) are eligible for Summer Learning. Consider taking courses with Continuing Education's Adult Secondary in September 2025.

My child will be absent on the first day of Summer Learning?

> Email rce@sd38.bc.ca - include child's name and the course he/she will be absent from. Absences after the start of Summer Learning can be communicated to the teacher or summer school office.

My child has allergies or health concerns?

> Please indicate any allergies or health concerns at the time of registration (under Custom Questions) and notify the teacher.

OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

◆ Learning Support

If your child has an Individual Education Plan (IEP) and/or a Vancouver Coastal Health Care Plan and is currently receiving additional learning support from an Education Assistant at school, ***we encourage you to register online before Friday May 9*** to ensure adequate support is available.

IEP - Students who attend a *non-Richmond School District school (public or private)* are asked to e-mail a copy of their IEP to rce@sd38.bc.ca

First priority for students requiring additional learning support will be given to Richmond School District students.

◆ Attendance

Summer Learning courses are held in person and students are expected to attend each course from start to finish. Absences of **more than three (3) classes are not permitted.**

Note: Students must be picked up on time at the end of each class.

◆ Withdrawals

Any request to withdraw from a course must be **submitted by email to rce@sd38.bc.ca** (be sure to include the student's full name, course name and reason for withdrawal).

◆ Refunds

Course registration fees are charged based on a student's status in Canada at the time of registration. No refund of fees will be provided should a student's status change between the time of registration and course start.

>> Fee-paying students who withdraw **before the start of the second class** may receive a refund, less a 15% processing fee. No refunds will be issued after the start of the second class.

Refunds will be issued in the same format as the original payment. Please allow 3 weeks for processing.

Course fees will be refunded in full if a class is cancelled due to insufficient enrolment.

◆ Course Locations & Cancellations

Course offerings are subject to sufficient enrolment. Start and end times and locations are subject to change.

ELEMENTARY ENRICHMENT COURSES

Concert Band for Beginner (Gr 4-7) / Intermediate (Gr 5-7)

This concert band music course is for students who either have not played a band instrument before or are switching to a new instrument (beginner), or have played an instrument for at least one year (intermediate). Concert band instruments are: flute, oboe, clarinet, bass clarinet, saxophones, bassoon, trumpet, French horn, trombone, tuba, bass guitar and percussion (drums and bells). Students are expected to provide their own band instrument or rent it through a local music store e.g. Tom Lee Music, Long & McQuade.

Language Arts for ELL - Levels 1-2

Designed for students who are English Language Learners (ELL) and wish to build, maintain or improve their English skills, students will participate in a variety of dynamic and interactive activities, including listening, speaking and reading.

English Reading/Writing

Students will begin by exploring different elements in a story, work on reading and oral language skills using appropriate reading, listening and viewing strategies, and develop their writing processes. They will learn the value of documenting their creativity and ideas, and explore how reading and writing can be a source of creativity and joy through a variety of short stories, looking at how texts can be understood from different perspectives. Students will discover different and creative ways of expressing themselves and to develop skills in using literary devices and techniques. Intermediate students will focus on creative writing by creating their own short stories, memoirs, and daily journal. These students will also learn ways to respond to examples of creative writing, and brainstorm creative writing ideas and experiences. Skill development will be enhanced through writing, editing and publishing a short story.

French Fun for Beginners

Students will explore the French language vocabulary as well as celebrate traditions of the French culture. Some of the topics and themes explored include self-introduction, foods, family, sports, clothing and things done at home, French verbs, etc. *This course is not for current French immersion students but may be beneficial to those going into Late French Immersion in September.*

Financial Literacy

Our financial literacy summer program offers hands-on learning in budgeting, saving, and investing. Students will engage in interactive workshops, real-life simulations, and fun activities to develop essential money management skills. By the end of the program, students will gain practical knowledge to make informed financial decisions and set a strong foundation for their future. Join us for an exciting journey into the world of finance this summer!

French Immersion (for students currently in French Immersion only)

Students will practise and enrich their knowledge of the French language and culture through games and activities. *(This course is for students who have completed at least one year of the French Immersion Program.)*

ELEMENTARY ENRICHMENT COURSES

(continued)

Math/Science Projects

Students will explore different concepts in the Math and Science curriculum. An emphasis will be placed on problem solving, critical and creative thinking, and exploring some of the big Math ideas (such as shapes, pattern, spatial awareness, numeracy, order of operations, data analysis and geometry). As well, students will explore a variety of scientific skills and processes and participate in various STEM projects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics).

Outdoor Exploration

NEW Course! Students will engage in outdoor games, orienteering, outdoor painting and photography, maker activities using natural materials, learn about local plants and animals, and use technology to create projects focused on sustainability.

Fine Arts

Students in our Summer Fine Arts integrated program will work with different teachers on a variety of inquiry-based and hands-on activities in all four areas of the Fine Arts Curriculum: visual arts, dance, drama and music. At the end of their summer learning journey, students will have a chance to showcase their learning through a Celebration of the Arts event, where their families are invited to attend.

Innovation

Summer Innovation will actively engage students in a variety of interdisciplinary, inquiry-based projects, using digital devices, technology, computers and applications.



SUMMER CAMPS - ELEMENTARY

(Fee-Based)

Art Around the World

ages 6-9 / \$400

Get ready for an art adventure! Each day we will journey through the outermost limits of our imagination as we explore art from exotic places around the world. Learn about culture and traditions of distant wonderful lands, and create and discover the beauty in art and in the richness in diversity of our world. Explore with different mediums like papier-mache, mixed media, watercolour, acrylics, and weaving.

Badminton Plus

ages 9-12 / \$400

Have fun while improving fitness and skills! Students will identify, describe and follow the rules and routines of safety in a gym; identify and discuss the benefits of healthy living while demonstrating a personal functional level of physical fitness. They will also practise motor skills in drills and games; apply basic offensive and defensive strategies; demonstrate etiquette, sportsmanship and fair play. Tournaments, contests and socialization will be a part of this camp. Students MUST bring their own badminton racquets.

Cooking & Baking Basics

ages 9-12 / \$500

Come join us for cooking and baking fun this summer! Learn how to make meals and bake yummy treats for yourself and to share with others! This class will be very hands on and will feature new recipes. Most recipes will be wheat-based. Dress comfortably and for safety reasons, no open-toed shoes. Participants will need to bring a large container to bring their treats home. Supplies are included in the camp fee.

Cooking Around the World

ages 9-12 / \$500

The "Cooking Around the World" camp will take students on a trip around the world with yummy culinary recipes for savoury and sweet dishes. The students will visit the foods of Italy, France, Germany, India, Thailand, Africa, Japan, Korea, Australia, America, Brazil, and more. They will discover a wide range of delicious flavours and ingredients, gain food preparation and clean-up skills, adopt sound food choices and healthy eating habits. Let's have fun in the kitchen!

Creative Art & Maker Camp

ages 6-9 / \$400

Calling all makers! Come tinker, explore and create a variety of hands on projects that are both art and maker focused. This camp is for students who enjoy hands-on activities, and creating and playing with a variety of material. Students will create things with clay, engage in felting, textiles (sewing), and perler beads. They will also explore with digital art, music, and storytelling just to list a few examples.

SECONDARY PROGRAMS

Academic Full Credit

Full Credit courses are rigorous courses, designed for school-age students who wish to earn credits towards graduation, to improve the mark of a previously taken course, or to satisfy post-secondary entrance requirements. Student attendance is crucial. Final grades of successfully completed full credit courses will be reflected on student transcripts.

Enrichment - Preview

Students will prepare themselves for the upcoming school year by choosing to preview courses in the areas of Business Ed, English Language Arts, Math, Science, Socials, Jazz Band and Physical Education. These non-credit courses will cover some of the Core Competencies, Big Ideas and Curricular Competencies along with indigenous perspectives and knowledge, through learner-centred and engaging activities. They will NOT cover the entire scope of a full course.

Enrichment - Review (Gr 8 & 9 courses)

Review courses are for Grades 8 and 9 students who will have completed the course during the regular school year, who are “emerging” or “low developing” on the Proficiency Scale and wish to strengthen their skills. These courses will focus on the understanding of key big ideas and competencies and will NOT cover the entire scope of a full course. Students completing these courses will receive an assessment based on proficiency scales.
