opportunity to have meaningful conversations about costume choices. It is important to keep in mind that we need to be sensitive to groups that have been marginalized through mimicry and cultural appropriation during Halloween and other 'dress up' events.

Students are welcome to wear costumes if they wish and have started to plan. We are asking students not to bring any weapon accessories to school if they are part of their

costume. We also know that some costumes have full masks. We are asking students that they do not wear their mask while at school, both inside the class and while outside during recess and lunch. Full masks can make it difficult for students to see, but also we want to able to identify students and masks can scare our younger students. Thank you for your understanding.

Richmond School District 38 is excited to welcome Kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2020, turning 5 in 2025. These children will begin Kindergarten in September 2025. Online registration opens on November 1, 2024. Please visit our website https://sd38.bc.ca/studentregistration/kindergarten-registration for more information about our online registration process, required documents, important dates, and FAQs.

We encourage families to complete their registration within the Priority I registration window, which spans from November 2024 to January 17, 2024, to maximize their chances of securing a spot at their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority I registration period will receive placement decisions by February 7, 2025.

Videos detailing Kindergarten registration have been made available on our District website, providing new parents with guidance on the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options (Early French Immersion and Montessori). Math and Numeracy at DeBeck

As a staff, we are focussing on how we teach math. We are specifically interested in supporting all students in applying their math knowledge to numeracy tasks (real life situations that require math). This week one of our District Teacher Consultants, Janice Novakowski came in to do a Number Talk followed by Math Workshop. Students in Division 11 participated in different



numeracy tasks in stations around the classroom. Each station provides different number choices and levels of difficulty so all students can participate. These stations address different curricular competencies in the grade 2 and 3 math curriculum.
