Student Placements (Organizing Classes for 2025-2026)

In the spring of each year schools begin their planning for the next school year. We have preliminary staffing meetings with board office personnel and review possible scenarios for organization in the Fall. The school population can fluctuate as students continue to move into the area, and some students transfer out. The final school organization and class placements occur in September, during the first week of school.

During this time, the professional staff at DeBeck begin to gather and share information in preparation for student placement in September. We are restricted by grades that are assigned to divisions (based on student numbers), and at times there are few options. We do however devote time, care, and effort in determining September placement. We include information about student strengths and needs, their social relationships (we try to ensure they have at least one friend), their interests, their learning styles, and previous placements.

Parental Input for Student Placement 2025-2026

Students are placed into classes in consultation with classroom teachers, learning resource teachers and principal/vice principal. Should parents/guardians wish to describe the learning situation and environment they feel best suits their children, or other factors which might influence placement, we ask that a letter be directed to Ms. Schwartz (lschwartz@sd38.bc.ca) by May 30th, 2025 to describe the learning situation and environment you feel best suits your child(ren). Please direct your email to Ms. Schwartz lschwartz@sd38.bc.ca The information you provide **should not** include a request for a specific teacher, but rather some important personal or educational information that will assist us in our decision. All letters regarding placement are shared with teaching staff.

After School Hours and the Playground

School staff do not provide after school hours supervision of the playground. We know that staying after school to play is a great way to connect with friends and get exercise. We know that when children are supervised, they are better equipped to navigate conflicts appropriately. If your children wish to stay and play on the playground or other areas etc., please supervise them to support them through any potential disagreements with others. 








AROUND THE SCHOOL- Division 1 Problem Solving Strategies
