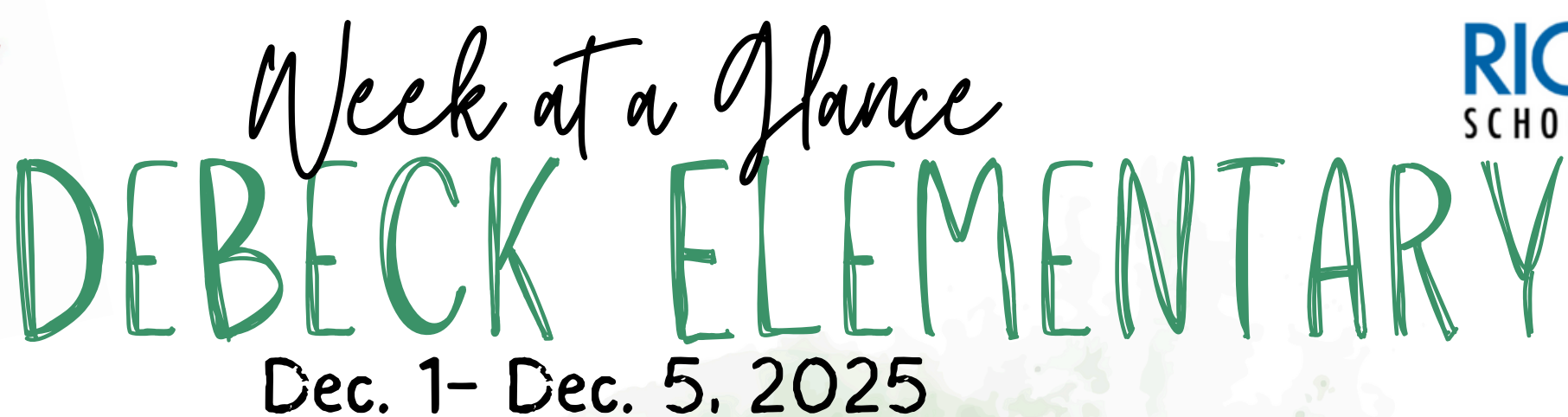

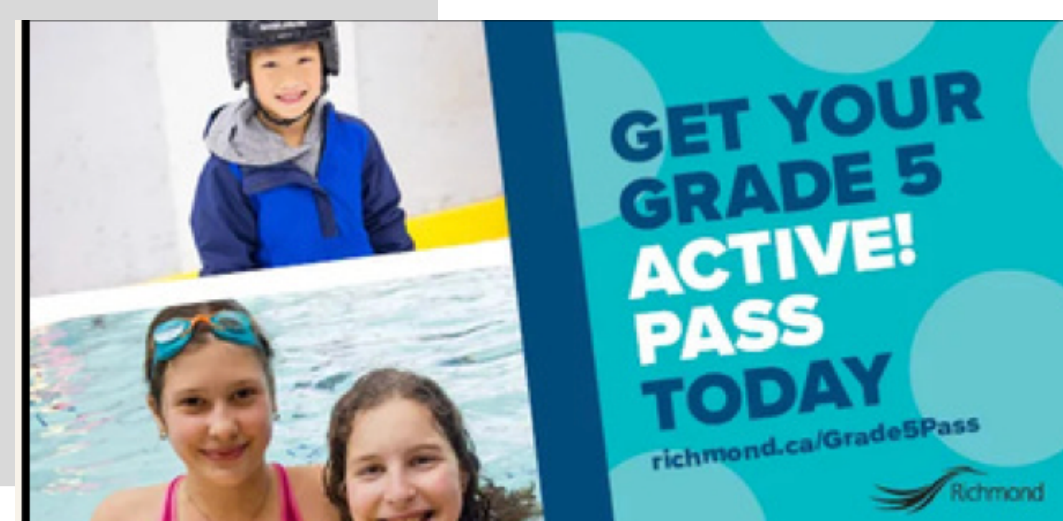
Safer Spaces Presentations

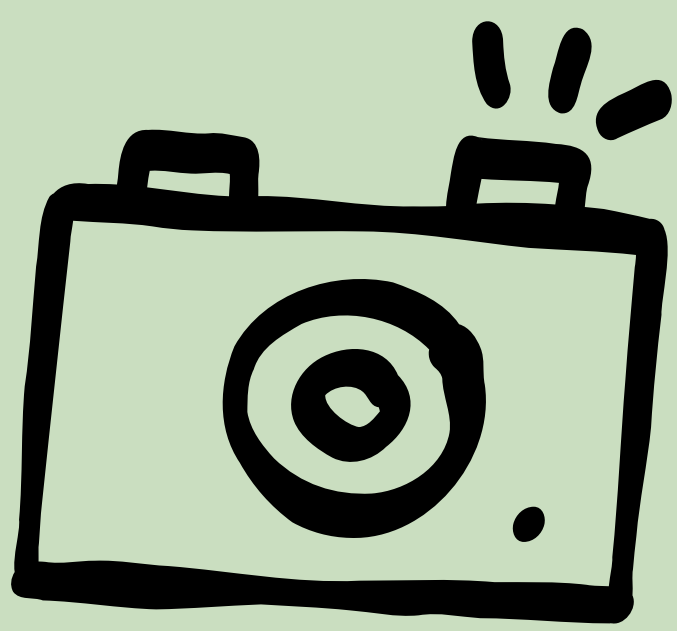
TCO2 (Taking Care of Ourselves, Taking Care of Others):
